
Once clicking on "Forgot Password" at the main login screen, and receiving an email with a temporary password, the following (and the first of two very busy screens) pops up:

- 1. Why are there "Username" and "Password fields" on this page? What does the customer fill in here? I have tested and it is not the temporary password. It also cannot be their permanent password as they forgot it, hence being at this screen. The two fields have no purpose on this page and only create confusion. It should be removed/hidden.
- 2. Why is there a "Change User" button? A customer only has one username? Why would they want to change to another non-existing user name? This button causes confusion and should be removed/hidden.
- 3. Why is there a "Forgot Password" button on this screen when the customer already went through the "Forgot Password" process and is in the process of changing a temporary password to a new one? This button should be removed.



Once this aforementioned screen has been mastered, a second, also confusing screen pops up:

- 1. It again shows the "User name" and "Password" fields, which again has no purpose on this screen, besides creating confusion. It should be removed/hidden.
- 2. The field "Current password" is the temporary password received via the "Forgot password" process, so definitely the fields mentioned in point 1 are not needed.
