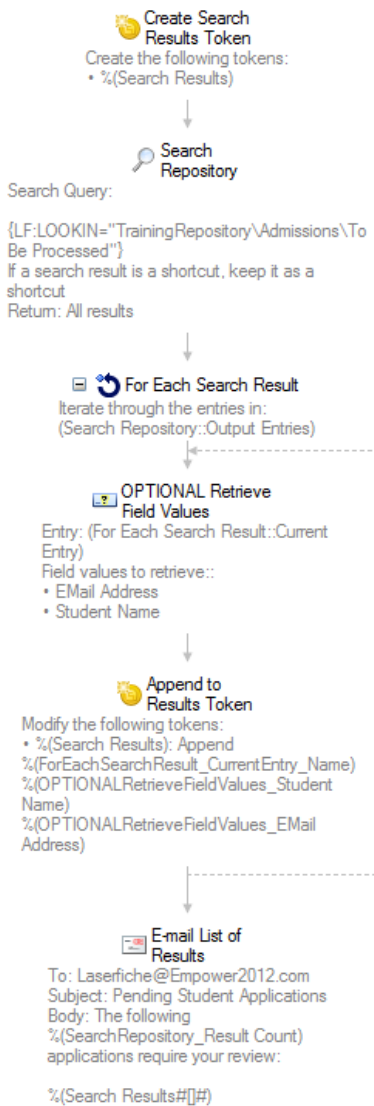

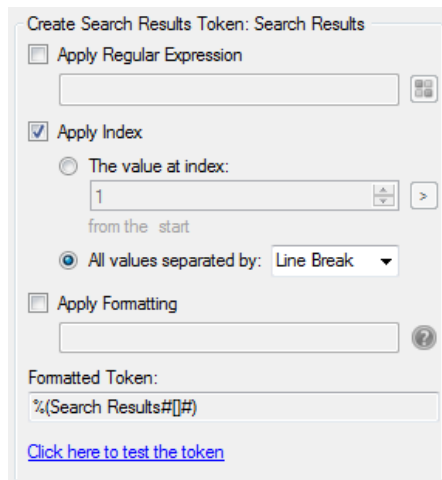
In Workflow 8.3, there are a number of activities that deal with collections: working with a set of entries, users, lookup values or field values. Recently, we've received a number of questions about how to send an e-mail that includes each entry returned from a search. Confusion comes from the fact that if you put an e-mail activity inside a For Each Entry activity, the system outputs a single e-mail for each entry returned in the search, which is not always ideal. Instead, a multi-value token should be used to gather information about each entry, and then that token can be inserted into the e-mail.

The key to this kind of logic is the Assign Token Values activity, which is used to both create and populate a multi-value token that can store information about each search result. As you can see in the screenshot below, this activity will be used once at the beginning of the search to create the multi-value token. Then, within the loop activity for each search result, values can be appended to the token. The values can come straight from the search activity, such as document name and path, or you can add more information by including field values. If you are using Web Access, you can include a hyperlink to the resulting document. After the loop activity, an e-mail will include this new token.



Here are a few tips to keep in mind:

- The token that you create should be multi-value, and each time it is updated it should have a value appended to it.
- Within the For Each Entry loop, be sure that the fields you retrieve and values you work with are coming from the current entry, not just from the first entry in the list of search results.
- When configuring the e-mail, the token dialog will be used to format the search results token that you created. Be sure to set the token to include all of the values separated in a logical way. As you can see in the following screenshot, this e-mail will send the information about each search result on its own line.



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
